**FROM FR. JOE...**

We're so very happy to welcome Bishop Terry LaValley to St. Helen's and St. John Bosco for Mass this weekend! Thanks for coming to be with us, Bishop!

With just a few other things going on around here lately, I somehow managed to miss that last Sunday was Respect Life Sunday--that is, until about 10 minutes before Saturday's vigil Mass. Ugh. My apologies to the 4:00pm crowd who didn't get the "full deal." October just snuck up on me, I guess. So it was back to the homiletic drawing board after supper last Saturday night to retool the message a bit. Those who wish can find the revised version of my homily on my blog: [www.fromemptyhands.blogspot.com](http://www.fromemptyhands.blogspot.com). (I actually think it's better than the first one.) We continue to pray in a particular way throughout this month of October for greater respect and legal protection of all human life, from the first moment of conception until the last breath of natural death.

October is also traditionally the month of the Holy Rosary. Fr. Bernie and I witnessed a curious event on the afternoon of October 1st in the park across from the priests' residence. The Society of St. Pius X--a traditionalist "breakaway" group of Catholics that is not in communion with the Pope--maintains a small chapel in Nicholville, and organized a procession with a statue of Mary across Arsenal Green and then around the block. About 75 people took part, praying the Rosary, singing hymns, and giving a moving public witness to their faith right here in Malone. I watched the proceedings, thinking: *We've got a Rosary Rally of our own coming up. If they can get 75 people...how many should we be able to get?* So consider taking part next Saturday, October 15, at 12noon at St. Joseph's, when the rosary will be prayed publicly--in particular, for the conversion of our nation. (Similar rallies will be taking place in more than 7,000 communities across America.) Let's make it many more than 75 next Saturday!

I'm happy to report that--as of last count--37parishioners have signed up so far to take part in the six-week *Biblical Walk Through the Mass* program, which begins on Tuesday of this week. There's still room, and still time to sign up. (In fact, you can just come to the session of your choice, even if you haven't registered yet.) This program should be a great way to not only get ready for the new translation of the Mass, but to get more out of Mass by understanding it much better. If you're able, be sure to take advantage of this special opportunity.
